The 2021SSAI convention was held on Oct 13 & 14 at the Heritage Inn Saskatoon. 24 delegates attended from rural Saskatchewan(representing 10 clubs) and met for presentations, socializing, discussions, resolutions, AGM reports, and elections.

Aspen Films was hired by SSAI to record the presentations, but also to provide a livestream option for people to attend the event online. The technology is complicated to ensure that those attending in person and online are all able to see and hear each other. Elaine L'Heureux nominated Barb Johnson for 2nd Vice; 2nd by Nici Warnock. Barb accepts the nomination. "Any further nominations?" x 3; Motion to cease nominations. **Barb Johnson is SSAI 2nd Vice** by acclamation.
